Looking to meet someone to start the year off right? There's still time. Richard Florida crunches the numbers for the best cities in America for single men and women to be this New Year's Eve.

Advice to the love-lorn: If you're single and hoping that you'll meet that special someone on New Year's Eve, you might want to travel somewhere to improve your odds.

If you're a guy, you should consider booking a ticket for New York City, where there are more single women than single men. Single women outnumber single men by a significant margin in many of the cities that make up the Bos-Wash Corridor, for example D.C., Philly, Boston, and Baltimore.

All the single ladies, to quote Beyonce, should avoid New York and the East Coast in general and head West—to L.A., Phoenix, San Diego, Dallas, Houston, San Francisco, or Las Vegas.
