We teach and test for memorization of information, which is soon obsolete, and not for our ability to create anything new. The only significant way to harness this full creative potential of all Ontarians is for the minister of education to take a bold step and decide that all schoolchildren need at least one hour a week of direct teaching of critical and creative lateral thinking skills.

We already know how to do this. We've been teaching cognitive thinking skills to our gifted children, who are more likely to enter the creative class, but have chosen to ignore all the rest to our economic peril.

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
